



Explanation of our Northland School Pepeha

What is the meaning behind this pepeha?

Kō Ahumairangi te pae maunga

Ahumairangi is the mountain (maunga). The maunga which watches over our kura (school). From the maunga we can see out to Thorndon where Pipitea Marae is located & the area of its former gardens. Pae maunga also refers to a mountain range

Kō Kaiwharawhara me Korimako ngā awa

Kaiwharawhara and Korimako are the rivers. These two key streams flow through our district and merge and flow out into Te Whanganui a Tara, our harbour. The former Kaiwharawhara pā (Kaiwharawhara settlement) was located near where the Kaiwharawhara stream meets the harbour

Kō Orangi Kaupapa te kura me te hāpori

Our school and our community
Hāpori is the Māori word for community

You would say this version if one person was saying Kō Ahumairangi te pae maunga this pepeha. Kō Kaiwharawhara me Korimako ngā awa Kō Orangi Kaupapa te kura me te hāpori ahau (add individual's name) or Κō Nō Kōtare au (I belong to Kōtare) o Kō Kōtare ahau (I am Kōtare) Tēnā kouto Tēnā kouto Tēnā koutou katoa
