Children need to have a bookbag as they will bring home independent reading every day.


In Terms 1 & 4 children should have a brimmed named hat at school.

What is story makers?


- Use of materials and arts as an integral role in language development

Maths is broken up into 2 parts (number and strand). We focus largely on number which is counting, adding subtracting, multiplying and dividing.




- Problem solving.

An important part of our number program is Numicon. Numicon is based on the concrete, pictorial abstract approach. So it encourages children to use materials to explore maths to better understand maths concepts and patterns.

- Zones of Regulation across the school.
- Emotions red, yellow, blue and green.
- Check ins
- Sensory box in each space.
- Use PB4L (Positive Behaviour for Learning) to teach expected behaviours
- Northland CHAMPs/ behaviour matrices
- Marbles and tokens for acknowledgements

C - confident (whakamanawa)

H - hikohiko (active)

A - auahatanga (creative)

M - manaaki (kind)

P - pataitai (curious)



Rotations: Ruru takes part in a weekly rotation including **skilled based PE**, **PE games** related to the skills taught, **music**, **singing** and **drama**. This is taken in individual classes. The children stay in this rotation for a week to build on their skills.
